1. BILL SUMMARY

- 1. **Legislation Title**: AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance 125429 to modify the effective date of certain sections of that ordinance.
- 2. Summary and background of the Legislation: In October 2017, the City Council adopted Ordinance 125429, which modified the Design Review Program and amended several sections of the Seattle Municipal Code. Many sections of Ordinance 125429 have delayed effective dates in order to allow adequate time for rule making. Section 28 of the ordinance, which amended Section 23.76.026 SMC, was inadvertently included in the list of sections with a delayed effective date of July 1, 2018. The proposed ordinance would amend Ordinance 125429 to make Section 28 of that ordinance take effect sooner than July 1. If adopted, the changes in Section 28 would go into effect at the time that the proposed new ordinance goes into effect, 30 days after adoption. The code changes relate to the vesting rules for projects undergoing design review and offer projects more flexibility to opt into newly adopted land use codes and rules. In addition, this ordinance removes superfluous language related to the July 1 effective date.
