a. Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE relating to the Department of Parks and Recreation; authorizing the acceptance of a donation of real property along the Burke-Gilman Trail in northeast Seattle, from the Estate of Jack Allbritton, for open space, park, and recreation purposes.

b. Summary and background of the Legislation:

This proposed legislation authorizes Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) to acquire, by donation, parcel number 022504-9013 along the Burke-Gilman Trail in northeast Seattle from the estate of Jack Allbritton. The legislation also allows for the acceptance of the deed to the subject property for open space, park, and recreation purposes. The donation of this property will lead to increased operating costs for the Department beginning next year.

DPR is continually acquiring property to expand existing parks and green spaces or to add new land to the parks system. The property authorized in this legislation consists of 8,507 s.f. of property along the Burke-Gilman Trail to the City's parks inventory. The property provides a green buffer along the trail that will enhance the experience of anyone who rides or walks along the Burke-Gilman.
