WHEREAS, Ballot Initiative 937 (I-937), also known as the Energy Independence Act, was passed by Washington State voters on November 7, 2006, which requires qualifying electric utilities to obtain new renewable resources and undertake cost-effective energy conservation; and

Section 1. Pursuant to RCW 19.285 et seq., WAC 194-37-070, and after public hearing, the City Council acknowledges and approves the City Light Department's ("City Light") adoption of a biennial energy conservation target of 24.5 average annual megawatts (aMW) for 2018-2019 and a ten-year conservation potential of 90.3 aMW starting in 2018. City Light's biennial energy conservation target and ten-year conservation potential are based upon a Conservation Potential Assessment conducted using methodologies consistent with those used by the Pacific Northwest Electric Power and Conservation Planning Council in order for City Light to pursue all available conservation that is cost-effective, reliable, and feasible.

Section 2. The City Council further acknowledges that City Light anticipates meeting or exceeding the biennial energy conservation target with its proposed 2018 budget and the spending plan adopted in the Strategic Plan's rate path for the 2019 budget.
