# SMC 6.500 Relating to regulation of marijuana businesses

Recommended amendments to align with state laws, provide equitable enforcement and to add clarity. Ordinance 124807 in 2015:

- Added Chapter 6.500 to the Seattle Municipal Code.
- Created a marijuana regulatory business license and accompanying regulations.
- Allowed for the full transition of the unregulated marijuana industry to a regulated system.

### Since 2015:

- Several updates to state law, affected items such as signage for marijuana retail establishments and minor access requirements.
- State law updates require amendments to provisions of Chapter 6.500.
- Other amendments are advisable to provide clarity, improve facilitation and compliance and allow for effective application and enforcement of Chapter 6.500.

## SMC 6.500 Relating to regulation of marijuana businesses Recommended changes and updates

#### Alignment with state law

• Due to changes in state laws, medical marijuana dispensaries had the opportunity to transition to licensed regulated business by July 1, 2016. Related SMC section is now obsolete.

### **Clarify definitions**

- Updated to match the state law.
- "Premises" removed this will streamline our regulatory authority over all marijuana businesses operating in Seattle, removal of the definition allows for equitable enforcement.

### Technical changes

Added the term of the license period, reorganization of sections and corrections.

#### New section

 Property owners must ensure that their lessee has a valid marijuana license before they open for business.
