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### 1. BILL SUMMARY

- 1. **Legislation Title**: AN ORDINANCE relating to the Central Puget Sound Regional Transit Authority ("Sound Transit"); authorizing execution of "Amendment No. 7 to the Construction Services Agreement between Sound Transit and the City of Seattle Relating to the University Link, North Link, and East Link Projects"; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.
- 2. Summary and background of the Legislation: The City and Sound Transit entered into the Construction Services Agreement between Sound Transit and the City of Seattle Relating to the University Link, North Link, and East Link Projects ("CSA") on or about August 12, 2009. The initial CSA only provided funding for the University Link project and subsequent amendments added funding for the North Link and East Link projects. Also, the initial CSA did not name the Lynnwood Link project which entered project development in 2010, after execution of the initial CSA, nor other future light rail projects.

The Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) has coordinated reimbursements for all departments, provided monthly invoices and progress reports to Sound Transit, and led development of the initial CSA agreement and previous amendments with Sound Transit.

This legislation authorizes Amendment 7 to the CSA ("CSA Amendment 7"). CSA Amendment 7 provides for construction assistance, construction services, and limited ongoing program management services for the Lynnwood Link light rail extension project and updates the agreement title to allow for the Lynnwood Light Rail extension project as well as potential future light rail projects. The revised agreement defines the Lynnwood Link project, adds designated representatives for this project and updates the designated representatives for all projects to reflect recent staffing changes, adds a construction schedule for this project as exhibit 2.3, adds a budget for this project as exhibit 3.3, and revises Exhibit 4, Acronyms and Abbreviations.

Without this legislation, City departments would be unable to provide construction services and construction assistance for Sound Transit's Lynnwood Link light rail extension project. Certain City construction services and assistance relate to the project's critical construction path; in other words, they must be performed before other construction and start-up tasks may proceed. Without the adoption of this legislation, the delivery of Sound Transit's Lynnwood Link light rail extension project, an essential public facility, could be compromised or delayed.

Reimbursement for Lynnwood Link construction services is anticipated to continue through 2023 at this time given the anticipated construction schedule; however, reimbursements may continue through 2024 or when Lynnwood Link opens if the construction schedule is revised.

# Revenue/Reimbursement Notes:

This legislation provides reimbursement to City departments for construction assistance, construction services, and limited ongoing program management for the Lynnwood Link light rail extension project. Per Exhibit 3.3 of CSA Amendment 7, the maximum reimbursement is \$8,045,580. In addition, there is a Sound Transit-controlled 7% contingency.
