Previously, at Building Changes, he was responsible for overseeing technical assistance, grant-making and evaluation of family and youth and young adult homelessness initiatives. At AIDS Housing of Washington, Mark consulted with cities nationwide to develop housing for people living with HIV/AIDS. Mark graduated from Whitman College and holds a Master's in Public Administration from Eastern Washington University, and is a graduate of the Nonprofit Executive Leadership Institute at University of Washington, Evans School of Public Affairs. He lives in Ballard with his wife and daughter. Mark is filling a vacancy on the Oversight Committee, and this is his first term.

- Increased operating budget from \$1M to \$2.2M via philanthropic grants and increased governmental support in first year
- Led creation of new Strategic Plan, new name and messaging in second year, and new data-driven action plan, including analysis by third-party consultant, in third year
- Increased CoC funding by 33% to \$35M, including 3 consecutive years of successful bonus project applications, by increasing percent allocated to permanent housing from 50% to 80%
- With All Home partners, increased number of homeless households exiting to permanent housing by 50% from 2013 to 2016, and reduced days homeless and returns
