a. Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to land use and zoning; amending Chapter 23.32 of the Seattle Municipal Code at page 90 of the Official Land Use Map to rezone property located at 1600 Dexter Ave N from Neighborhood Commercial 3 with a pedestrian designation and a 40-foot height limit to Neighborhood Commercial 3 with a pedestrian designation, a 75-foot height limit, and the MHA suffix. (Petition by Brook V, LLC, C.F. 3021980, SDCI Project 3016200)

b. Summary and background of the Legislation:

This bill would effectuate a quasi-judicial rezone of an approximately 13,785 square foot property at 1600 Dexter Avenue North from Neighborhood Commercial 3 with a 40-foot height limit and a pedestrian zone designation (NCP3-40) to Neighborhood Commercial 3 with a 75-foot height limit, a pedestrian zone designation, and a mandatory housing affordability suffix (NCP3-75 (M1)).

Brook V, LLC, the applicant, plans to redevelop the site with a six-story apartment building with approximately 85 residential units, 4,000 square feet of retail space and one live-work unit at the street-level. Parking for 54 vehicles will be provided below grade. The proposed structure height would be approximately 65 feet in height.
