All-Gender Restroom Ordinance

- 1. Requires all single-occupancy restrooms have gender neutral signage
- 2. Clarifies rights to use gender-specific facilities with their gender identity (SMC 14.06)
- 3. Effective date: March 9, 2016

All-Gender Restroom Ordinance

Outcomes

- 1. 42 reports received
- 2. 83% compliance
- 3. 76% food establishments



Ban on Conversion Therapy

- Prohibits the use of conversion therapy practices or treatment to change a person's sexual orientation or gender identity – on minors
- 2. Effective date: October 3, 2016

Ban on Conversion Therapy

PROVIDING CONVERSION THERAPY TO MINORS IS ILLEGAL IN SEATTLE.

Alternative Source of Income

- 1. Requires landlords to accept all sources of income and housing subsidies
- 2. Prohibits preferred employer programs
- 3. Must accept community pledges
- 4. First-in-time provisions
- 5. SOID effective date: October 3, 2016
- 6. First-in-time effective date: July 1, 2017
