## **1. BILL SUMMARY**

1. Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE granting City Investors XXV LLC permission to construct, install, and maintain two sets of private communication conduits under and across 8th Avenue North, south of Harrison Street and north of Thomas Street, for a tenyear term, renewable for two successive ten-year terms; specifying the conditions under which this permit is granted; and providing for the acceptance of the permit and conditions.

## 2. Summary and background of the Legislation:

This legislation will allow City Investors XXV LLC to construct, maintain, and operate two sets of private communication conduits across 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue North, south of Harrison Street and north of Thomas Street. An area map is attached for reference.

The communication conduits permit is for a term of ten years commencing on the effective date of the ordinance, with two renewable ten-year terms. The legislation specifies the conditions under which authorization is granted and provides for acceptance of the permit and conditions.

City Investors XXV LLC is to pay the City of Seattle an annual fee of \$2,613.60 commencing on the effective date of the ordinance, and annually thereafter. Adjustments to the annual fee may be made every year and if so made shall be calculated in accordance with a term permit fee schedule adopted by City Council by Ordinance 123485. An Annual Fee Assessment Summary is attached for reference.
