#### 1. BILL SUMMARY

- 1. **Legislation Title**: AN ORDINANCE relating to Seattle Public Utilities; accepting easements granted to The City of Seattle for installation, operation and maintenance of hydrants, water mains, domestic meter vaults, fire service meters and appurtenances necessary for water utility purposes at various locations in Seattle; placing the property rights and interests conveyed by the easements under the jurisdiction of Seattle Public Utilities; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.
- 2. **Summary and background of the Legislation**: This ordinance would authorize the City of Seattle to accept four utility easements for property acquisitions necessary to meet the requirements of the grantors' property developments.

The Seattle Department of Construction and Inspections (SDCI) in some instances requires hydrants or other water facilities be installed for property developments. The property rights accepted by the City pursuant to this ordinance are for utility installations on private properties required for DCI project approval.
