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WHEREAS, industry participants have requested the City Council enact legislation to establish a
minimum fare for all segments of the industry that ensures equal market access and
establishes an industry aligned with the City's values of fairness, shared prosperity, and
transparency; NOW, THEREFORE,

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE THAT:

Section 1. The City Council requests that taxicab companies, for-hire vehicle companies, and transportation network companies (TNCs) provide the Director of Finance and Administrative Services the following data for each driver associated work collaboratively with each company at any time in calendar year 2017: designated City staff to develop a list of data that they will voluntarily share with the Council through a secure mechanism, that will be responsive to the Council's need to have a clear understanding of the total number of current state of the for-hire industry as it formulates policies. City staff will include and consider the distribution of: 1) the hours the driver worked, or in the case of TNCs, were the hours active on the companies' platform, 2) the total duration number of trips the drivers completed, the total distance traveled with the passenger in the vehicle, the distance traveled to pick up the passenger, and, in the case of the TNCs, the distance traveled while logged onto the company's app. 3) the value of the fares charged, and 4) the total compensation to each driverdrivers for calendar year 2017. The data shared should be anonymous and provided to the City by no later than May 31, 2018. If the requested information is not provided to the Director of Finance and Administrative Services by May 31, 2018, the Council will consider legislation requiring the data from all market participants, including possibly drivers, to support the formation of City Council policy for the industry.
