



Median household income by King County Neighborhood, 1990-2015



Median family income by family type, King County (2005-2016)






Poverty impacts at least 1 of every 4 Seattle residents



Parents who responded "yes" to the question, "During the past 12 months, was there someone that you could turn to for day-to-day emotional support for parenting or raising children?"



Parents who responded "excellent or very good" to the question, "In general, how would you describe this child's health?"




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
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
Health conditions that affect student performance






City of Seattle Data Requests (2016)N=17 Requests
