Week-long closure each year 2008-2012



- August 2012
- 63% approval
- \$123 million seven-year levy





4 Levy Promises:

- Keep libraries open when patrons need them
- Provide a robust collection of books and materials
- Improve computer and online services
- Maintain buildings for the next generation

The levy also includes support for an additional \$5M of cuts the Library would otherwise have had to take during the economic downturn













Changes in Library use since 2012

- More community outreach
- Increased circulation of digital materials
- Increased reliance on free Wi-Fi
- More programs
- More challenging environment

2017 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Retained 6,000+ new open hours systemwide
 - Open 52 weeks a year
 - 7-day service at Columbia and Northgate branches
 - All locations open Sunday
 - Added 32 open hours per week by restoring Friday hours at International District/Chinatown, University, High Point and South Park branches
- Offered 1,500+ outreach events to bring Library services to every Seattle community

2017 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Launched Peak Picks, no hold, no wait collection of popular books systemwide
- Added Kanopy streaming movie service
- Added 60, 000+ new titles in the physical and digital collections
- Bought 31,000+ more copies of popular materials to shorten wait times
- Implemented "floating collections" for DVDs, CDs and most books to reduce transit time and improve collection variety at branches

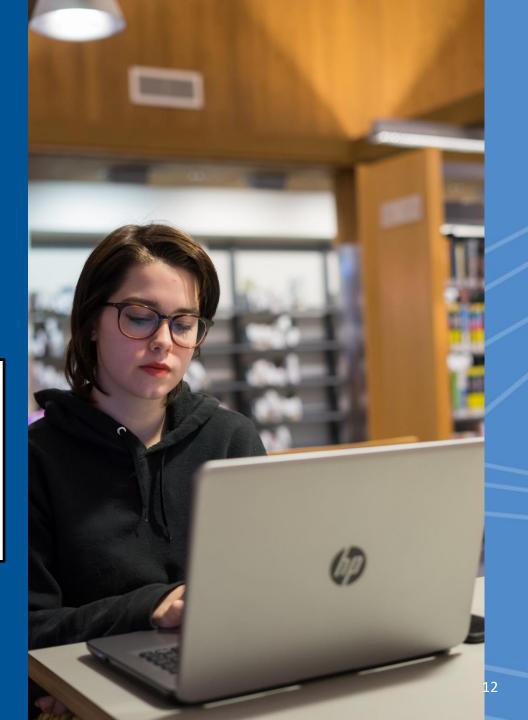

2017 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Completed design and testing of new website for public use in early 2018 that is mobile friendly for the increasing number of patrons using cell phones as their primary device
- Offered 300+ technology classes to teach patrons how to use email, the internet, and adobe in-design and how to spot fake news, etc.
- Replaced 353 levy-funded public computers
- Installed new scanning, printing and copying equipment in all branches

In all my years of life this will be the first time I have gotten to use a laptop. Maybe now I can use this for practice and eventually get my own laptop!

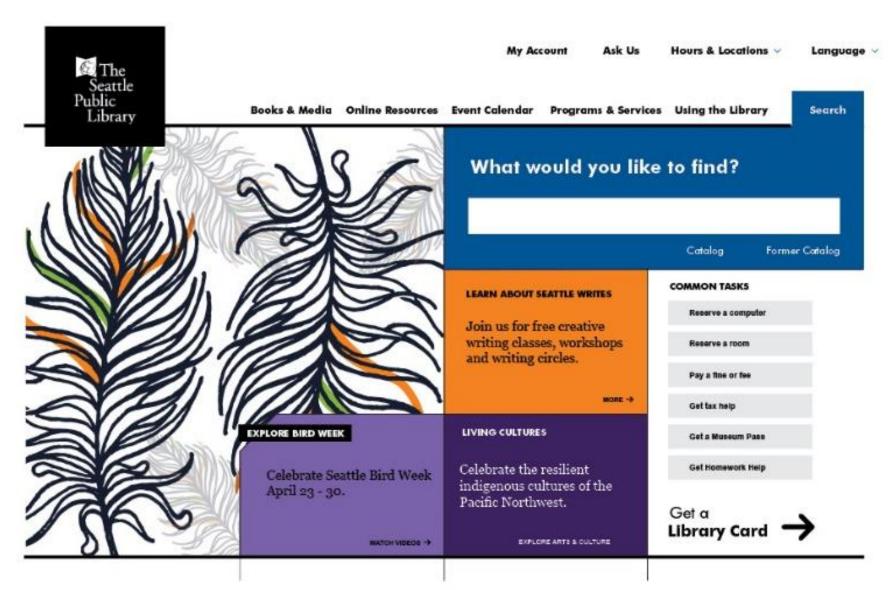




Website redesign

Wonderful!! So much information packed into the site and I can use my phone to browse.

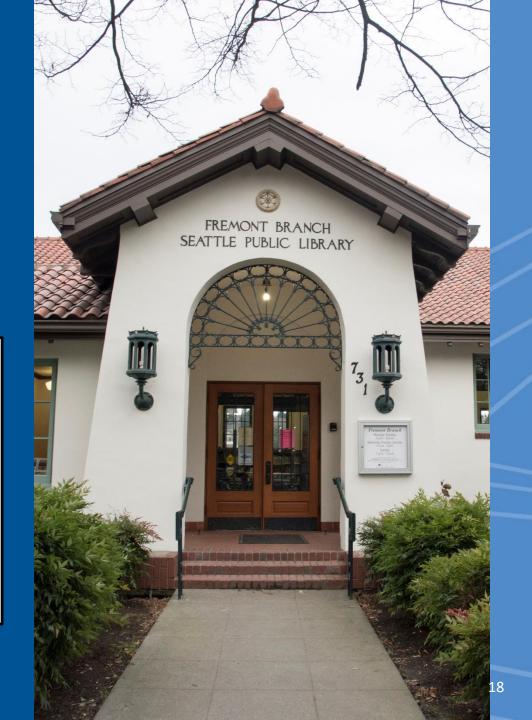






Preserving our assets

2017 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

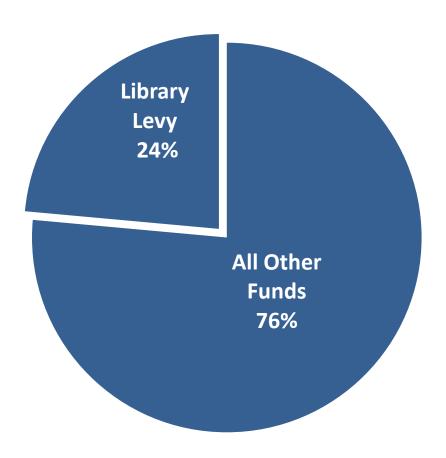
- Completed refurbishment of Beacon Hill, Greenwood and High Point branches and initiated plans for Lake City and South Park branch projects
- Completed 12,000+ work orders to keep some of the City's most heavily used buildings clean, efficient and in good working order
- Performed deep carpet cleaning, high dusting, window washing and upholstery cleaning at all locations
- Completed exterior repairs at Fremont Branch and safety improvements at Central Library

2017 Library Budget

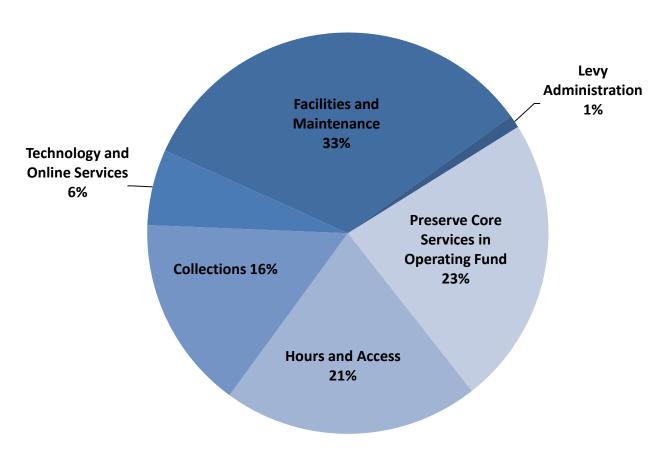
