1. BILL SUMMARY

1. Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE conditioning the Seattle Department of Transportation's 2018 grant applications.

2. Summary and background of the Legislation:

The Council passed ordinance 125205 which restricts the projects in the CIP that SDOT can apply for grants that are over \$5.0M. This legislation will allow SDOT to compete for grant funds for Market / 45th Multimodal Corridor project. SDOT is interested in applying for a Washington State DOT Regional Mobility Grant on July 13, 2018. The funding for the grant will be available from July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2023. This time period aligns with the project design and construction schedule. SDOT is planning to fund this project with local and state sources (no federal grant funds). This is expected to be the only grant request for the project which makes it critical that we can exceed the \$5M cap.
