
Seattle's Police Chief Search

Engaging with the community to find Seattle's next Chief of Police.

The Police Chief Search Committee undertook an extensive community outreach and engagement process - this was in partnership with one of the leading national search firms who has led many major city police chief searches. The Mayor's Office partnered with the Community Police Commission and 50 community stakeholders to host **14 meetings in neighborhoods across Seattle over the course of two months.**



Record-Breaking Online Survey Participation

Understanding that not everyone can attend a community meeting in-person, the Mayor's Office also launched an online survey, **available in 15 languag**es, to help ensure that all Seattle residents had the opportunity to provide feedback on their priorities for our City's next permanent Chief of Police.
