

Seattle's Wholesale Water Customers

- Seattle sells water on a wholesale basis to over 20 suburban cities and utility districts
- Wholesale cost allocation and rate setting is detailed in water supply contracts that run through 2062
 - Under contracts, annual costs and revenues are compared, and a running balance of over- or under-collection is maintained
 - Surplus or deficit is taken into account next time rates are set




Southwest Wholesale Surcharge

- Council adopted the majority of wholesale water rates in 2017
- The Southwest subregional surcharge was delayed until 2018 due to changes in metering equipment needed to complete the rate study
- This surcharge pays for the additional infrastructure needed to deliver water to five wholesale customers not reached by Seattle's regional water system

Proposed Southwest Surcharge

The Southwest surcharge is decreasing due to several factors:

- Past over-collection has resulted in a surplus of revenues as compared to allocated costs
- Decrease in demand that had been incorporated into 2018 rates now delayed past 2023

2018 Rate	Proposed 2019-2023 Rate	Annual Impact
\$0.16 / ccf	\$0.07 / ccf	\$380k/year decrease
