



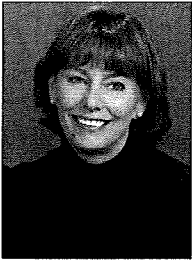

Betty Spieth and partner Sarah Langton opened the consulting firm Langton Spieth LLC in 2002 offering a combined 30 plus years of regional leadership. "We work with clients and partners on projects that enhance community and economic viability of this region, and that promote and protect the quality of life environment we cherish in Washington State."

Betty served for nine years on Seattle's Citizen Oversight Committee for the Bridging the Gap transportation levy (2006-15), the full term of the levy. She recently retired from service on the boards of Lake Washington College Foundation and Pacific Crest School, Seattle, and previously served on the boards of Seattle CityClub, Leadership Eastside, Seattle King County Economic Development Council, the Housing Partnership, Seafair, University District Food Bank, Eastside Business Roundtable, Leadership Institute, and the Washington Chamber of Commerce Executives. She and husband Tim Croll are active in and leaders of their church, University Congregational United Church of Christ.

Betty is a graduate of the Institute for Organization Management, Notre Dame University, a program of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce. She graduated from Knox College, Galesburg Illinois (Modern Languages) where she spent over a year living in Barcelona Spain, and in France.

"Work in the Seattle and the University District, East King County, and on statewide transportation issues may appear unrelated, but each represents a complex system that requires understanding and working with the community to identify solutions. Langton Spieth specializes in bringing the right people to the table to move an issue forward for the betterment of all interests," says Betty.
