1. BILL SUMMARY

1. Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to the City Light Department; declaring certain real property rights surplus to the needs of the City Light Department; authorizing the sale of an easement for sidewalk purposes to Snohomish County; and accepting the payment of fair market value for the easement.

2. Summary and background of the Legislation:

This ordinance declares certain real property rights that are no longer necessary for transmission line purposes surplus to the needs of the City Light Department, authorizes grant of an easement to Snohomish County, and accepts payment for the easement.

Seattle City Light owns certain real property in fee simple at the intersection of 161st Street Southeast and Sunset Road in Snohomish County, Washington. The real property is part of City Light's transmission corridor located immediately south of City Light's Bothell Substation.

Snohomish County is improving Sunset Road under its Sunset Road Pedestrian Improvement Project. Snohomish County needs to purchase an easement for sidewalk purposes over a small portion of the City Light property. The sidewalk must be routed through the City Light property because of the location of one of City Light's electric towers. Granting a sidewalk easement to Snohomish County will not impede City Light's ability to access, construct, operate, or maintain its transmission corridor, lines, or structures.

This legislation is necessary because all grants of easements must be authorized by legislation passed by City Council.
