



2018 Public Safety Survey

- Survey conducted in English, Chinese, and Vietnamese online and via paper surveys


Demographics: Age




Demographics: Gender




Demographics: Primary Language



Demographics: Is this your first time taking the survey?




Demographics: Main CID Affiliation






How often residents feel safe in the CID




Safety during different times of day






Decline in faith in police



Perceptions of cleanliness mixed




Reasons for Not Reporting Violent Crimes

- Top reason: belief someone else already called
- Respondents 36 and over: concern for their own safety and belief that someone else already called
- Chinese language respondents: someone else called

Witnessed to the Police




Top Reasons for Not Reporting a Non-violent Crime

- -Top reason for 18+: Police wouldn't follow up
- English language respondents: belief police would not follow up
- Chinese language respondents: concern for personal safety and belief that police would not follow-up

Corresponding key finding(s):

• 71.2% of respondents did not agree or somewhat agree that streets are cleaner in 2018 than in 2017

Restore funding to geographicallybased homeless outreach programs

Corresponding key finding(s):

• Danny Woo/Kobe Terrace Park and I-5 Underpass are consistently rated the least safe areas in the CID and both have significant homeless populations.

Fund and support improvements and activation in I-5 underpass area

• I-5 Underpass was again rated the least safe area in the CID

Implement improvements and updates to street lighting per recommendations of the lighting study.

Corresponding key finding(s)

• Respondents rated darker times of day as significantly less safe than daytime hours

Improve 911 responsiveness

Corresponding key finding(s):

 Most common reason for not reporting a non-violent crime was the belief that police wouldn't follow up.
