1.	<b>Legislation Title:</b> AN ORDINANCE relating to the regulation of short-term rental businesses; amending Sections 6.600.030 and 6.600.040 of the Seattle Municipal Code.						
2.	Summary and background of the Legislation: The legislation would extend an exemption to the limit on the number of dwelling units a STR operator can offer for STR use. Under the existing regulations, that go into effect on January 1, 2019, an operator can obtain a license to operate their primary residence plus one additional dwelling unit as a short-term rental. Within the core of Downtown, and units in certain building types in the First Hill/Capitol Hill Urban Center, units an operator offered for STR use prior to September 30, 2017, are exempt from this limit. This legislation would apply the exemption uniformly to all operators offering units for STR use prior to September 30, 2017. The intent is to provide more certainty that the revenue projections for the STR tax will be realized and sufficient to support proposed expenditures in 2019 and 2020.
