


Arboretum Loop Trail - Vicinity Map




Arboretum Loop Trail - Background / Timeline

- SR 520 mitigation funding \$7.8 million
- 2011 Public involvement begins with multi-use trail design
- January 2013 WSDOT/Arboretum Botanical Garden Committee agreement finalized
- 2015-2016 Project bid and rebid
- March 2016 Construction notice to proceed
- November 2017 Project completed following the wettest period in Seattle history



Fritz Hedges Waterway Park - Background

- Site former UW Police Station and Bryant Marina
- Purchased from UW with WSDOT funds from the SR 520 expansion project
- Mitigation funding for SR 520's impacts to Washington Park Arboretum, East Montlake and McCurdy parks (waterfront trail)
 - \$9.0 million WSDOT mitigation
 - \$2.4 million From University of Washington to address site contamination
- McCurdy Park Federal Land and Water Conservation Funding; protected under that legislation
- Existing buildings will be demolished
- Park will include historical elements, water access for people and hand-carried boats and areas of open lawn for passive recreation



Fritz Hedges Waterway Park - Project Schedule

- 2015-17: Public Involvement Process included:
 - 3 SPR public meetings
 - 2 online open house meetings
 - 4 Design Commission meetings
- 2017-2018 Design, construction document preparation and bidding
- August 2018 Project construction begins
 - Interior lead and asbestos abatement work has been completed
- November 2018 Early 2019 Building and dock demolition and remediation
- Early 2019 Construction of park features begins
- Spring 2020 Park completion
