1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance 125706 to modify the effective date of that ordinance.

Summary and background of the Legislation: This legislation modifies the effective date of Ordinance 125706, which updates street use permit fees, to June 15, 2019 to align the fee updates with SDOT's implementation of its new permitting system. The Budget Committee approved Green Sheet 35-30-A-2, which established the effective date of Council Bill 119388 (now Ordinance 125706) as June 15, 2019, but that amendment was not incorporated into the legislation before passage.

City of Seattle Departments, e.g. SPU and SCL, may pay increased use fees, depending on the nature and sequencing of their work in the right of way. These increases will be minimal overall; under this ordinance, the departments will begin paying the increased fees on June 15, 2019 instead of April 1, 2019.

Is there financial cost or other impacts of *not* implementing the legislation?
SDOT planned to implement the new fees on June 15, 2019 in alignment with its new permitting system; an April 1, 2019 effective date would require modification of the existing permitting system which would then be abandoned in June.
