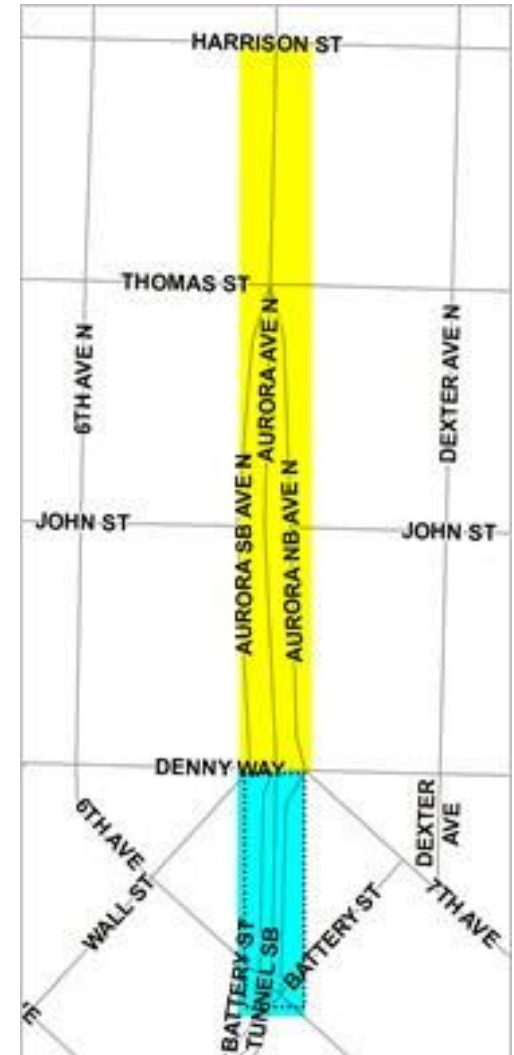

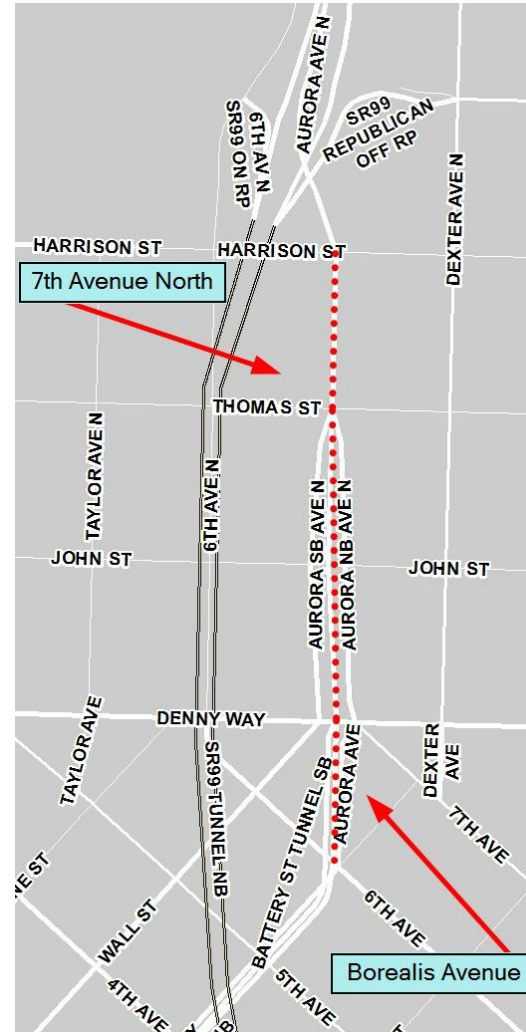
# Background

This legislation will officially change the name of segments of Aurora Ave N and Aurora Ave to 7<sup>th</sup> Ave N and Borealis Ave as the SR99 tunnel opens and north surface streets are ultimately reconnected

- Name changes requested by community
- Aurora Ave known as 7<sup>th</sup> Ave before the Alaskan Way Viaduct was constructed
- South of Denny, 7<sup>th</sup> Ave requires new and unique name to avoid confusion with parallel block of the 7<sup>th</sup> Ave extending from DT street grid at Battery St
  - Borealis was first choice for community members



# Project area



## Existing ROW:

- Aurora Ave N from Harrison St to Denny Wy
- Aurora Ave from Denny Wy to Battery St

## New roadway will extend:

- Battery St to Harrison St, and will intersect Denny Wy, John St, Thomas St, and Harrison St.
- north end of the new roadway will connect to Aurora Ave N by ramp



# Proposal

- Change the name of Aurora Ave N, north of Denny Wy to the historic 7<sup>th</sup> Ave N name
- Change the name of Aurora Ave, south of Denny Wy, to the new and unique Borealis Ave name
  - The historic 7<sup>th</sup> Ave name would conflict with the existing segment of 7<sup>th</sup> Ave that extends from the downtown street grid north of Battery St
