1. BILL SUMMARY

a. Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE relating to The City of Seattle's Myrtle reservoir radio-transmitter facility; authorizing the Director of Finance and Administrative Services to execute a lease with King County for its use of part of the radio-transmitter facility for the new, regional Puget Sound Emergency Radio Network; declaring the part of the facility leased for King County's use to be surplus to the City's utility needs; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.

b. Summary and background of the Legislation:

Summary: The Department of Finance and Administrative Services ("FAS") seeks authority to enter into a lease with King County (the "County"). The lease will govern the Puget Sound Emergency Radio Network's ("PSERN"'s) use of part of the property on which the City's Myrtle reservoir radio-transmitter facility (the "Myrtle Transmitter") is situated. PSERN will use the property to construct a new, 140-foot monopole (which will accommodate both PSERN and City of Seattle antennae) and a small communications building. The Myrtle Transmitter is adjacent to Seattle Public Utilities' Myrtle Reservoir but is leased to FAS pursuant to an interdepartmental agreement. The FAS/PSERN lease is thus technically a sub-lease, and it has an initial term of twenty-five years with options to extend for three (3) additional five-year terms. PSERN will pay FAS \$20,000 in annual land rent, subject to annual 2% escalations beginning in 2020.

Background: In 2015, voters approved a ballot measure authorizing the funding of a new, upgraded, regional public safety emergency radio network - PSERN. The network is being implemented through the Puget Sound Emergency Radio Network Implementation Period Interlocal Cooperation Agreement ("PSERN Agreement"), by and among the County, the City of Seattle ("City"), and other King County cities. The City is a signatory to the PSERN Agreement pursuant to Ordinance 124687 which authorized the City's Department of Information Technology to enter into an interlocal agreement governing the formation of PSERN. Under the PSERN Agreement, the County is the lead agency for the financing, procurement, contracting and implementation of PSERN. Upon implementation of the PSERN network, the signatories to the PSERN Agreement will establish a jointly-governed entity to manage and operate PSERN.

Under the PSERN Agreement, the City agreed to make available for PSERN's use certain City-owned sites, including the Myrtle Transmitter site, for the installation and operation of PSERN equipment.

Absent the passage of this legislation, the County and Motorola would be forced to find another location suitable for the installation of the PSERN monopole and the facility to support its operation, which could result in additional cost to the PSERN signatories, delay the implementation of PSERN, and/or potentially expose the City to a claim of breach of the PSERN Agreement.

Furthermore, in the absence of the \$20,000 in annual land rent from PSERN for its use of the Myrtle Transmitter (an estimated \$580,000 in rent over the twenty-five-year term of the lease, taking into account the agreement's provision providing for 2.0% annual rent increases), FAS would have no third-party revenue to offset its annual land rent to Seattle Public Utilities for the Myrtle Transmitter (currently this amount is \$21,102).
