

Location: Laurelhurst, off 43rd Ave NE

Features: Basketball court, lawn,

plantings and water access

Size: 9,931 square feet

Permit Term: 5 years

Waterway 1 Background

- Waterway 1 has been used by the Laurelhurst community as a park for decades.
- Until 2013, the Laurelhurst Community Club held the permit from DNR for the public use of Waterway 1.
- In 2012, DNR changed its insurance policies which made it prohibitively expensive for the club to hold the permit.
- In 2013, Seattle Parks and Recreation agreed to hold the permit for Waterway 1, provided that the Laurelhurst community continue to maintain the public space.
- In 2014, the City and Friends of Waterway 1 signed a MOA obligating the Friends of Waterway 1 to maintain Waterway 1 for the enjoyment of the community.
