Legislation Title:

An ordinance relating to paid sick and safe time; extending paid sick and safe time to the employees of Seattle School District No. 1; and amending Section 14.16.010 of the Seattle Municipal Code.

Summary and background of the Legislation:

The City's Paid Sick and Safe Time regulations (SMC 14.16), created by Ordinance 124960 in 2015, exempted all counties and local government employers <u>except</u> for the City of Seattle. This bill would add Seattle Public Schools to the exceptions from the blanket exemption. The effect would be to extend the City's Paid Sick and Safe Time regulations to the Seattle Public Schools.
