Multi-Year Policy Focus

Promoting stable housing for women and families

Annual Work Plan Priority Areas

Community Health & Wellness

Advocate and raise awareness about maternal health issues, especially the maternal death rate for Black and Native women.

Equitable Development

Identify and address barriers to shelter and housing and to support safe, affordable, and accessible housing and transit options for women and families.

Promote economic and educational equity for all women in Seattle

Bi-Annual Work Plan Priority Areas

Our goal is to lead our work with a trans justice and racial equity lens.

Commission Changes: two-year workplan and new committees, Commission Operations, Social Media & Communications Committee, People of Color Stakeholders, and Community Outreach Committee

Advocate for QTPOC Housing and Inclusive LGBTQ Homelessness Services

- Explore Rainbow Alliance and greater LGBTQ Community Land Trust
- Serve on HSD SLI Workgroup and relaunch 5-Chair Homelessness Taskforce
- Build better relationship with the Rainbow Alliance and other QTPOC led coalitions

Increase Accessibility, Access, and better Community Relationships

- Hold general quarterly meetings in the community
- Produce and post videos of people of interest in the LGBTQ community
- Advocate for better technology for Commission meetings
- Decriminalizing Sex Work Support Reentry Workgroup recommendations and continue partnership with Sex Workers Outreach Project (SWOP)

SEATTLE COMMISSION FOR PEOPLE WITH disABILITIES

Bi-Annual Work Plan Priority Areas:

Commission as a whole: Establish full membership while promoting a culture of intentionality, respect, collaboration, engagement and cohesiveness

Inclusion Development and Outreach: Emphasize recruitment and attracting diverse candidates. Support individuals through nomination and onboarding process to the commissions. Bridge gaps between disability community AND institutions and community organizations (of all types).

Accessibility: Enhance full participation throughout increased access and promote universal use of accessible communication/information in the areas of *Housing, Education, and Transportation*.

Intersectionality: Address inequitable systemic and institutional structures. Intersectionality is used to explain the accumulative and compounded effect of two or more social identities.
