**Legislation Title:** A RESOLUTION in support of a woman’s right to bodily autonomy and the right to access a safe and legal abortion; and affirming The City of Seattle’s commitment to act consistently and proactively in support of those rights.

Wade*. It confirms that the City is committed to proactively protecting those rights and eliminating the stigma around abortion, asks the City Attorney’s Office to work with the Council to determine how to support challenging bans in other states, and asks the Office of Intergovernmental Relations to circulate the resolution upon adoption.
