WHEREAS, Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) has solicited the Seattle Department of

Transportation regarding the City's readiness to accept and rapidly obligate contingent grant funding for the East Marginal Way Heavy Haul Project; and

WHEREAS, PSRC requires obligation of contingent grant funds by July 15th, 2019 but will not award funds until June 2019; and

WHEREAS, these grant funds require execution of agreements; and

WHEREAS, spending of these grants will begin in 2019; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. In order to pay for necessary costs and expenses incurred or to be incurred in 2019, but for which insufficient appropriations were made due to causes that could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of the making of the 2019 Budget, appropriations for the following items in the 2019 Budget are increased from the funds shown, as follows:
