1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance 125724, which adopted the 2019 Budget, including the 2019-2024 Capital Improvement Program (CIP); changing appropriations to various departments and budget control levels, and from various funds in the Budget; revising project allocations for certain projects in the 2019-2024 CIP; creating both exempt and non-exempt positions; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts; all by a 3/4 vote of the City Council.

Summary and background of the Legislation: This Council Bill, which is the first supplemental ordinance in 2019, proposes several adjustments to the 2019 Adopted Budget.

The City Budget Office compiles departmental requests for spending adjustments to the Adopted Budget into a quarterly Supplemental Ordinance for review and approval by the City Council. These quarterly Bills accomplish the following:

- Implement programs approved in the Adopted Budget or subsequent legislation;
- Creates a new Budget Control Level and appropriation
- Makes changes to departments position authority
- Creates new capital improvement projects;
- Adjusts for unanticipated actual and projected revenues;
- Appropriates funding backed by new revenue sources, such as grants and private donations.

This supplemental ordinance is accompanied by a Grant Acceptance Ordinance.
