WHEREAS, existing sources of funding for affordable housing and permanent supportive housing are insufficient to meet the needs of all individuals and families experiencing housing cost burden, displacement, and homelessness in Seattle; and

WHEREAS, Seattle residents and families experiencing severe housing cost burden,

displacement, and homelessness are disproportionately people of color; and

WHEREAS, investments in affordable housing provide access to opportunity for low-wage

workers and their families, increase mobility from poverty, and foster inclusive

WHEREAS, investing in permanent supportive housing is a proven, cost-effective, and humane

1	WHEREAS, during the 2019 session, the Washington State Legislature enacted SHB 1406
2	(published as Chapter 338, Laws of 2019) that authorizes cities that have enacted a
3	qualifying local tax, such as The City of Seattle's 2016 housing levy under RCW
4	84.55.050, to impose a local sales and use tax of 0.0146 percent; and
5	WHEREAS, the local sales and use tax will be credited against the state sales and use tax so that
6	the total tax paid by the consumer will not increase; and
7	WHEREAS, the local sales and use tax revenue shall be spent on acquiring, rehabilitating, or
8	constructing affordable housing or supportive housing and other related expenditures as
9	authorized by Chapter 338, Laws of 2019; and
10	WHEREAS, the local sale and use tax revenue shall be used to assist persons whose income is at
11	or below sixty percent of the median income of the City; and
12	WHEREAS, Chapter 338, Laws of 2019 authorizes The City of Seattle to issue general
13	obligation or revenue bonds to carry out the purposes of the legislation and to pledge the
14	revenue collected by the local sales and use tax to repay the bonds; and
15	WHEREAS, Chapter 338, Laws of 2019 requires that a city that desires to impose the tax must
16	adopt a resolution of intent to adopt legislation to authorize the maximum capacity of the
17	tax within six months of the effective date of Chapter 338, Laws of 2019; and
18	WHEREAS, The City of Seattle desires and intends to exercise its authority to impose the
19	maximum tax authorized under Chapter 338, Laws of 2019; and
20	WHEREAS, This resolution constitutes the resolution of intent required by Chapter 338, Laws of
21	2019; NOW, THEREFORE,
22	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE, THE
23	MAYOR CONCURRING, THAT:
