


Housing Affordability: A Racial Equity Issue

Severe Housing Cost Burden by Race/Ethnicity


Over 25% of Black/African American owners, and close to 35% of Black/African American renters, pay more than half of their incomes for housing.





Race Demographics of OH Funded Housing




Race/Ethnicity of Residents Seattle

Support for Women and Minority Owned Business (WMBE)



	WMBE Goal	Actual
Purchasing	40%	77%
Consulting	20%	18%
Weatherization	NA	45%

- Multi-family lending staff encourages housing developers to increase
 WMBE participation
- Asset Management staff incorporates message encouraging WMBE utilization in site inspection reports

Change Team Development

- OH Change Team has grown to 14 members, doubling in size to include over 30% of department staff
- CT Work: Staff trainings, staff survey, RSJI focused events, staff newsletter

Policy Goal: Address historic and current displacement by providing preference for community residents during leasing or sales

- Supporting creation of Othello Square, the city's first-ever limitedequity cooperative
- Supporting Yakima Homebuyer Club
