# BACKGROUND

## EMERGENCY LOW INCOME ASSISTANCE (ELIA) PROGRAM

---

- Program was established in 1985 by City Light
- Funded through City Light rates
- Available to City Light residential customers with incomes up to 70% of State median income
- Offered to customers in imminent danger of being disconnected from their service (i.e., shut-off notice received)

## REASONS FOR AMENDMENTS

---

- This legislation amends existing Seattle Municipal Code (21.49.042) to make rate assistance more accessible and to align with other City utility rate assistance programs.
- These amendments will help our customers avoid disconnections thru easier access to the Emergency Low Income Assistance (ELIA) program.

## AMENDMENT CHANGES

---

- Eligible upon receiving a 10-day shut-off notice (from 24-hour notice).
- Credit is allowed twice per year with minor child(ren) in the home (from once per year)
- Maximum credit of 100% of bill amount up to program limit of \$200 (from 50% of bill)
- Maximum credit will be adjusted yearly to match average City Light rate growth
