Purpose of Legislation

- This legislation authorizes the partial relinquishment of three utility easements and the acceptance of two utility easements
- When property owners develop their property, they may be required to put SPU facilities on private property
- To operate SPU facilities such as storm sewers or sewer lines on private property, the City requires easements for access, operations and maintenance



Benefits


- Relinquishes and accepts permanent property rights in multiple locations
- Establishes SPU's rights to operate City facilities on private property
- No cost to rate payers
- Batching relinquishment and acceptance documents saves time for SPU, Council and other departments
