8	WHEREAS, in Resolution 31931, the Seattle City Council ("Council") established a Watch List
9	of large, complex, discrete capital projects that will require enhanced quarterly
10	monitoring reports for the 2020 calendar year; and
11	WHEREAS, under normal conditions, the West Seattle Bridge is the busiest roadway in the City
12	of Seattle, handling some 100,000 vehicle per weekday along with 17,000 transit riders,
13	and ferry traffic from Vashon Island and Kitsap County; and
14	WHEREAS, on March 23, 2020, the Seattle Department of Transportation closed the high-rise
15	West Seattle Bridge to all traffic due to accelerated concrete cracking that was identified
16	during regular bridge inspection; and
17	WHEREAS, the West Seattle Bridge will require near-term structural stabilization, as well as
18	long-term repairs, to allow for the reopening and continued operations of the bridge; and
19	WHEREAS, the closure of the West Seattle Bridge requires the diversion of traffic to the
20	Spokane Street Bridge, 1st Avenue Bridge, and South Park Bridge, and may require other
21	road and signal improvements to handle the diverted traffic, such as improvements to the
22	Highland Park Way SW and SW Holden Street intersection; and
23	WHEREAS, the Council intends to track work related to the near-term and long-term repair of
24	the West Seattle Bridge and any mitigation projects necessary during closure; and

1	WHEREAS, the Council anticipates future amendments to the 2020-2025 Adopted Capital
2	Improvement Program to account for changes in appropriations to support these repairs
3	and improvements; NOW, THEREFORE,
4	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE, THE
5	MAYOR CONCURRING, THAT:
6	Section 1. In addition to the capital projects listed in Section 1 of Resolution 31931, the
7	Seattle City Council ("Council") requests that the Mayor add any capital projects with spending
8	related to the near-term repair, long-term repair, and mitigation during closure of the West
9	Seattle Bridge to the 2020 Watch List for enhanced quarterly reporting as described in Section 2
10	of Resolution 31931.
