Michael Thomas Little SCL Green Up Program ORD 1 CITY OF SEATTLE ORDINANCE 126179 2 3 119885 COUNCIL BILL 4 5 AN ORDINANCE relating to the City Light Department; amending Section 21.49.084 of the Seattle Municipal Code to enable a broader suite of voluntary renewable energy program 6 7 options to City Light customers. 8 9 WHEREAS, chapter 19.29A.090 RCW requires that electric utilities offer retail electricity 10 customers a voluntary option to purchase qualified alternative energy resources beginning 11 January 1, 2002; and WHEREAS, the City Light Department ("City Light") has complied by offering two voluntary 12 13 programs beginning with the Green Power Program in 2002 and continuing with the 14 Green Up Program in 2005; and 15 WHEREAS, 19.29A.090 RCW limits the utility's voluntary program to providing qualified 16 alternative energy-resource options; and 17 WHEREAS, the Green Up Program established in Seattle Municipal Code Section 21.49.084 18 continues to offer City Light customers the opportunity to voluntarily support qualified 19 alternative energy resources; and 20 WHEREAS, in 2019 the Seattle City Council adopted Resolution 31895, a Green New Deal for 21 Seattle, where Section 7 notes that the City will continue to invest in programs that make 22 renewable energy sources more affordable and develop options for community-scale, 23 community-owned distributed generation of electricity in low income communities; and 24 WHEREAS, customers are seeking a variety of renewable energy products and services to meet 25 their sustainability objectives; and

revenue obligations, the Department shall make available from its budgeted funds, for the

purchase or development of new qualified alternative energy resources, an amount equal to the

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1	((Net Green-Up Revenue)) net program revenue allocated to existing Department qualified
2	alternative energy resources.
3	B. The Department may offer to customers additional renewable energy programs that
4	support non-qualified energy resources, provided that:
5	1. Customer participation in additional programs shall be voluntary and available
6	to all customers. Customers may voluntarily begin or terminate their participation at any time by
7	notifying the Department of their choice.
8	2. Additional programs shall encourage the adoption, availability, or affordability
9	of renewable energy resources for the Department and its customers. Renewable energy projects
10	supported by customer voluntary payments may include, but are not limited to:
11	a. The purchasing, funding, or partial funding of renewable energy
12	projects.
13	b. Projects for deploying technologies to acquire renewable energy
14	including projects located at local, low-income, non-profit, or public facilities.
15	c. Other activities intended to build awareness or to enable renewable
16	energy projects through energy education, demonstrations, or collaborative efforts with
17	community partners.
18	3. Additional programs will be entirely self-funded from voluntary program
19	payments, including, but not limited to, costs of program projects, activities, administration, and
20	marketing. Subject to ordinances authorizing issuance of the City's municipal light and power
21	revenue obligations, the Department shall make available from its budgeted funds an amount
22	equal to the voluntary program payments.
