## **Budget Action description:**

This green sheet recommends passage of C.B. 119377, which would reestablish a Business License Tax (B&O Tax) deductibility of income received by life science research organizations from grants, contracts, and subawards from government sources. The City offered this same deduction for 5 years (June 2012 – June 2017) under Ordinance 123877. The primary beneficiaries of the previous deduction were nonprofit research entities receiving income from previously taxable sources. Nonprofit entities, which collectively received roughly 85% of the tax benefit from the 2012 legislation, were already able to take deductions for federal grants, but not for contracts or sub-awards. Private sector entities were not allowed to take deductions for any grants, contracts or sub-awards. The cost to the City in lost General Fund revenues from 2012 through 2017 was approximately \$500,000 per year. The revenue forecast accompanying the Mayor's Proposed 2019-2020 budget incorporates a \$500,000 annual reduction in revenues due to the assumed approval of this legislation.
