

# Winter Storm Response – Shelter Recap



Garfield Community Center prior to opening on February 11, 2021

#### Severe Weather Shelter Sites:

- Fisher Pavilion
- Garfield Community Center
- Bitter Lake Community Center
- City Hall
- First Presbyterian

#### **Operations/Details:**

- Operated over span of 6 days
- 24-hour a day operations
- 90% occupancy (Peak: 216 occupied beds, out of 239)
- Three meals a day provided
- Showers available at Fisher, Garfield, and Bitter Lake
- COVID-19 safety precautions

# Winter Storm Response – HOPE Team

### **During the storm, the HOPE Team and Parks:**

- Conducted 380 welfare checks
- Shared information with 310 individuals about the temporary severe weather shelters
- Provided 277 individuals winter supplies (hats, gloves, hand warmers, etc.)
- Provided basic needs supplies (water, snacks, etc.) to 237 people
- Transported 42 individuals to temporary shelter

Both these programs will be supported by COVID-specific ESG funding for **Rapid Re-Housing**, which will offer access to housing with up to 12 months of supportive service for as many as 230 households

Women's Shelter at First Presbyterian Church	Serve up to 60 people  HSD contracts with Catholic Community Services as fiscal sponsor  Catholic Community Services works with WHEEL to operate shelter	Open now as overnight-only  **Opened during winter storm as 24/7 emergency shelter**	Provider staffing up to meet 24/7 operational needs  Will be fully operational this spring

## **Update** – HOPE Team

#### Enhanced Shelter Referral Process

- The new shelter resources coincide with enhancements to the shelter referral process
- Enhancements made in collaboration with contracted outreach and shelter service providers through weekly meetings
- The aim to improve the efficiency, accuracy, and equity of service connections
- The HOPE Team is actively coordinating outreach priorities in partnership with providers and City departments
- The goal is to leverage contracted outreach's ability to work with encampment occupants to accept shelter
