Amendment Name: SPD Surveillance Technologies Equity Metrics

Effects Statement: Requests the Seattle Police Department to report no later than the end of the 3rd quarter of 2021 on the metrics provided to the Chief Technology Officer for use in annual equity assessments of the 911 Logging Recorder, Computer Aided Dispatch, CopLogic, and Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) for Patrol and ALPR for Parking Enforcement surveillance technologies.

Proposed Amendment:

<u>Insert a new Section after Section 1 of Council Bill 120004 as follows:</u>

Section 1. Pursuant to Ordinances 125376 and 125679, the City Council approves use of the Seattle Police Department's 911 Logging Recorder, Computer Aided Dispatch, CopLogic, and Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) for Patrol and ALPR for Parking Enforcement and accepts the Surveillance Impact Reports (SIRs), for these technologies, attached to this ordinance as Attachment 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 and the Executive Overviews, for the same technologies, attached to this ordinance as Attachment 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10.

Section 2. The Council requests the Seattle Police Department to report no later than the end of the third quarter of 2021 on the metrics provided to the Chief Technology Officer for use in the annual equity assessments of the 911 Logging Recorder, Computer Aided Dispatch,

CopLogic, and Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) for Patrol and ALPR for Parking

Enforcement technologies.

Section ((2))3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.
