Bob Hennessey SPU SCL Fee Waiver ORD 1 CITY OF SEATTLE ORDINANCE 126355 2 COUNCIL BILL 120089 3 4 5 6 AN ORDINANCE relating to the City Light and Seattle Public Utilities Departments; 7 temporarily removing the charge of interest on delinquent utility consumption and 8 utilization accounts; superseding several sections under Title 21 that authorize and 9 require the collection of interest on delinquent utility consumption and utilization 10 accounts; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts. 11 12 WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020, the United States Department of Health and Human Services 13 Secretary Alex Azar declared a public health emergency, beginning on January 27, 2020, 14 as a result of the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) outbreak in the United States; 15 and 16 WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Washington on February 29, 2020 issued 17 Proclamation 20-05, proclaiming a State of Emergency for all counties throughout the 18 state of Washington; and 19 WHEREAS, on March 3, 2020, Seattle Mayor Jenny Durkan proclaimed a civil emergency 20 exists in the City of Seattle; and 21 WHEREAS, while this practice of social distancing is critical in mitigating the rate of spread of 22 the COVID-19 virus, it is having significant negative economic effects on the national 23 and regional economy, in particular small businesses and workers in large sectors of the 24 Seattle-area economy who cannot work remotely; and 25 WHEREAS, Seattle Public Utilities has several Seattle Municipal Code provisions requiring 26 collection of interest on delinquent utility consumption and utilization charges; and

1 WHEREAS, Seattle Municipal Code ("SMC") Section 21.49.130 authorizes the City Light 2 Department to charge interest on delinquent utility consumption and utilization accounts, 3 but requires compliance with SMC Chapter 3.02 procedures for any changes; and 4 WHEREAS, a consistent temporary policy towards relief from the collection of interest on delinquent utility consumption and utilization policy is intended for utility ratepayers 5 6 having difficulty paying their bills in full; and 7 WHEREAS, the relief effectuated by Ordinance 126254, which extended the policy, expires 8 June 30, 2021, necessitating another ordinance to continue the relief; NOW, 9 THEREFORE, 10 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS: 11 Section 1. No new interest charges shall be added to utility consumption and utilization 12 accounts for residential customers, customers that are non-profit organizations as defined under 13 Seattle Municipal Code subsection 5.30.040.C, or commercial customers with taxable gross 14 annual receipts of less than \$5 million in 2019 on bills issued from January 1, 2021 until the earlier of: 15 16 A. Termination of the civil emergency proclaimed by the Mayor on March 3, 2020; or 17 B. January 1, 2022. 18 Section 2. To the extent the following sections or subsections of the Seattle Municipal 19 Code that authorize or require the collection of interest on delinquent utility customer 20 consumption and utilization charges are inconsistent with Section 1 of this ordinance, they are 21 superseded during the time period stated in Section 1: 22 21.04.470.D (Bills for water used — Delinquency); 23 21.28.260 (Billing and collection of wastewater charges);
