Seattle-based songwriter Sue Ennis has co-written more than 70 songs for Heart, (30 million records sold and 2013 inductees in the Rock n Roll Hall of Fame). Hits include "Dog & Butterfly," "Straight On," and "Even It Up." She has co-written songs for feature films including The Golden Child starring Eddie Murphy, and Thomas and The Magic Railroad; and her hobby band, The Lovemongers, appeared on the soundtrack of Singles. Sue scored and wrote the songs for "Art Dog," a stage musical produced at The Seattle Children's Theatre. She teaches Music Business, Career Development and Songwriting at Shoreline Community College. She also teaches "Songwriting for Film" for the Seattle Film Institute. Sue was recently re-elected by the PNW Grammy Board to serve as their national Trustee on the board of the Recording Academy ("The Grammys.") and was appointed to co-chair the national Committee for Advocacy for the Recording Academy. Currently, she is developing a jukebox musical with a nationally known Broadway producer and Tony-winning director, for which she is writing the book. And perhaps most crucially, Sue is a proud volunteer as a songwriting coach and band mentor at Rain City Rock Camp.
