## **Budget Action Description:**

This Council Budget Action would amend and recommend passage of CB 120228. The amended legislation would authorize an increase in the Commercial Parking Tax (CPT) rate from 12.5 percent to 14.75 percent. The rate increase would become effective on July 1, 2022. Based on the City Budget

## 2022 Seattle City Council Budget Action

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Office's (CBO's) November economic forecast update, the rate increase would generate approximately \$3.3 million of additional CPT revenue in 2022. The rate increase is anticipated to generate approximately \$6.5 million of additional CPT revenue in future years.

This Council Budget Action would amend Section 1 in CB XXXX to make the following changes: (1) Delete the sentence, "Effective July 1, 2022, the parking tax rate is imposed at 14.5 percent."

(2) Add the sentence, "Effective July 1, 2022, the parking tax rate is imposed at 14.75 percent."

This Council Budget Action would add \$2.8 million in 2022 and \$6.5 million in future years to Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) Capital Improvement Program (CIP) projects as follows: (1) \$1.215 million in 2022 and \$2.9 million in future years for the Structures Major Maintenance (MC-TR-C112) CIP project;

(2) \$1.1 million in 2022 and \$2.9 million in future years for the Vision Zero (MC-TR-C064) CIP project; and

(3) \$480,000 in 2022 and \$730,000 in future years for the Sidewalk Safety Repair (MC-TR-C025) CIP project.

The additional funding for the Sidewalk Safety Repair project would provide a dedicated funding source to implement SDOT's Policy Recommendations for Sidewalk Repair report (as requested by Resolution 31908), such as funding the sidewalk shim and bevel program.

This Council Budget Action also generates financial resources (\$470,000) to support SDOT-001-B-001 and SDOT-004-B-001 in 2022.

The impact of this Council Budget Action on the Structures Major Maintenance project is shown in Attachment A. The impact of this Council Budget Action on the Vision Zero project is shown in Attachment B. The impact of this Council Budget Action on the Sidewalk Safety Repair project is shown in Attachment C.
