#### Timeline of Events on May 30th, 2020

The Seattle Police Department managed a series

of demonstrations throughout the day on Saturday, May 30<sup>th</sup>, 2020. In the early hours of the day, many of these groups were demonstrating peacefully, but by midafternoon several incidents quickly devolved into situations that endangered the lives of those demonstrating as well as our officers. At approximately, 2:45 pm Saturday, a peaceful demonstration at Westlake Park continued as groups in the vicinity of Westlake at 5<sup>th</sup> and Pine began to escalate. At approximately 3:55 pm, demonstrations began to grow across the entire city to approximately 10,000 individuals.

By mid-day Sunday, May 31<sup>st</sup>, we know there were hundreds of buildings and businesses damaged including more than 90 at least 25 businesses in the Chinatown-International District. At least 8 cars were burned and additional vehicles were damaged. We are not aware of any serious injuries, but we do know there were community members injured and at least 6 officers injured. There were 57 arrests, most for burglary and assault, on May 30.
