COUNCIL BILL _____

AN ORDINANCE authorizing, in 2015, acceptance of funding from non-City sources; authorizing the heads of the Executive Department, Department of Planning and Development, Department of Parks and Recreation, Human Services Department, Seattle Police Department, and the Seattle Public Utilities to accept specified grants and private funding and to execute, deliver, and perform corresponding agreements; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor or the Mayor's designee, the Director of Planning and Development, the Director of the Human Services Department, the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation, and the Chief of Police are authorized to accept the following non-City funding from the grantors listed below, and to execute, deliver, and perform on behalf of The City of Seattle, agreements for the purposes described below. The funds, when received, shall be deposited in the receiving fund identified below to support, or as reimbursement for, the corresponding appropriations set forth in the ordinance introduced as C.B. _____.

| 1.2 | Department of Planning and Development (DPD) | US Environmental Protection Agency | This grant supports consultant resources to conduct public outreach, produce GIS maps, and publish reports on the measurement and costs for restoration. | \$110,920 | Planning and Development Fund (15700) |
| 1.3 | Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) | National Recreation and Park Association | The grant will be used for Environmental Education. The funding has been received, and the project will be completed by August 31, 2015. | \$20,000 | Park and Recreation Fund (10200) |

| 1.5 | Human Services Department (HSD) | Seattle Housing Authority | The majority of the grant provides support to the existing Rapid Rehousing program for families, with \$20,000 supporting the single adult Rapid Rehousing program. | \$320,000 | Human Services Operating Fund (16200) |
| 1.6 | Human Services Department (HSD) | United States Conference of Mayors | The grant will allow the Farm to Table program to expand to additional family centers, child care, and before and after school programs. | \$25,000 | Human Services Operating Fund (16200) |
| 1.7 | Human Services Department (HSD) | Seattle Chamber of Commerce | This grant will support the Mayor's Youth Employment Initiative, and will provide funding for internships for youth and young adults. | \$545,600 | Human Services Operating Fund (16200) |
