ORDINANCE \_\_\_\_\_

COUNCIL BILL \_\_\_\_\_

AN ORDINANCE authorizing, in 2017, acceptance of funding from non-City sources; authorizing the heads of the Executive Department, Department of Parks and Recreation, Seattle Fire Department, Seattle Police Department, the Seattle Department of Transportation, and the Cable Television Franchise Subfund to accept specified grants and private funding and to execute, deliver, and perform corresponding agreements; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. The Mayor or the Mayor’s designee, the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation, the Fire Chief, the Chief of Police and the Director of Transportation are authorized to accept the following non-City funding from the grantors listed below, and to execute, deliver, and perform, on behalf of The City of Seattle, agreements for the purposes described below. The funds, when received, shall be deposited in the receiving fund identified below to support, or as reimbursement for, the corresponding appropriations set forth in the ordinance introduced as Council Bill 119123.

1.2	Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR)	United Way of King County	The grant will be used to support DPR's Youth Programming to increase access to the Summer Meals Program/Summer Expanded Recreation Program.	\$36,660	Park and Recreation Fund (10200)

1.3	Executive	Department of Social and Health Services	The WA Dept. of Social and Health Services (DSHS) contracts with OIRA to support the New Citizen Program (naturalization case management, which OIRA subcontracts to community based providers).	\$35,000	General Subfund (00100)
1.4	Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT)	Federal Emergency Management Agency	The grant resources will be used for the Columbia Street Areaway to mitigate seismic risk. The scope involves the following steps: remove the existing structural sidewalk, construct a new structural wall between the adjoining property and the areaway, fill the areaway with lightweight concrete, and replace the structural sidewalk with a conventionally constructed cast-in-place sidewalk.	\$1,520,649	Transportation Operating Fund (10310)
1.5	Seattle Fire Department (SFD)	Department of Homeland Security (DHS)	This grant provides for the continuation of current BioWatch program activities in the Seattle area. These activities include air-quality testing and monitoring for 18 collector sites and strengthening the area's response network with respect to biological terrorism.	\$1,213,706	General Subfund (00100)
1.6	Seattle Fire Department (SFD)	State of Washington (State Patrol)	This grant supports the training of firefighter recruits.	\$10,374	General Subfund (00100)
1.7	Seattle Fire Department (SFD)	State of Washington (Criminal Justice Training Commission)	This grant supports reimbursable Crisis Intervention Team and Fire/EMS In-service training provided by the Washington State Criminal Justice Training Commission to members of SFD's emergency response teams.	\$8,736	General Subfund (00100)

1.8	Seattle Fire Department (SFD)	Washington State Department of Transportation	The item is reimbursement for inspections of the Fire Life Safety Systems for the SR West Approach Bridge North Project that were conducted by SFD's Assistant Fire Marshall and New Construction Inspector.	\$6,112	General Subfund (00100)
1.9	Seattle Police Department (SPD)	Department of Homeland Security	This grant funds community programming in the Police Department in partnership with Department of Neighborhoods, Department of Parks and Recreation, Office of Immigrant and Refugee Affairs and Seattle University.	\$409,390	General Subfund (00100)
