## CITY OF SEATTLE

A RESOLUTION proclaiming that Seattle affirms the United Nations Declaration on Human Rights Defenders in the wake of increased targeting of local activists.

WHEREAS, in 1998 the United Nations (UN) General Assembly adopted the "Declaration on the right and responsibility of individuals, groups and organs of society to promote and protect universally recognized human rights and fundamental freedoms," commonly known as the Declaration on Human Rights Defenders ("Declaration"); and

WHEREAS, the main purpose of the Declaration is to protect human rights defenders and their activities; and WHEREAS, the United States signed, but did not ratify, the Declaration; and

- WHEREAS, the UN Special Rapporteur on the situation of human rights defenders has written that states should use the twentieth anniversary of its passage as an opportunity to affirm the Declaration and make it more visible and accessible to everyone; and
- WHEREAS, Seattle has previously been proclaimed a Human Rights City via Resolution 31420; and
- WHEREAS, Washington State has seen an increase of human rights defenders being targeted for persecution; and
- WHEREAS, more than one of these defenders have sought support against their persecution, but have instead been further persecuted by the federal administration; and
- WHEREAS, the Seattle Police Department has limited resources to address cybercrimes, and consequently these defenders believe local law enforcement is under-resourced to provide protection and security, particularly from cybercrimes; and
