





- Helps the public plan ahead



- STP reinforced sections of viaduct with carbon fiber
- In 2012, STP crews installed steel micropiles underground





Tunneling operations

- Tunneling around the clock
- Frequent field updates
- Real-time monitoring of the machine and ground
- Soil reconciliation

Monitoring program

- WSDOT implemented a comprehensive monitoring program before construction began.
- Ground monitoring efforts in Pioneer Square expanded in early 2015.
- Tools include monitoring equipment on buildings and the viaduct and laser imaging technology.



- Temporary stops on 3rd Ave (southbound)




