Overview

- Seattle Parks and Recreation (SPR) seeks to acquire greenspace property located in southeast Seattle's Taylor Creek Headwaters, using existing appropriations, pending Council approval
- SPR has reached agreement with property owner to acquire a vacant parcel (14,000 square feet)
- Acquisition will help preserve the last surviving urban headwater wetland in a salmon-bearing creek in Seattle and add to existing City ownership
- The Taylor Creek Watershed spans north and south of the City-King County line and extends through Lakeridge Park to Lake Washington


Relation to Taylor Creek Watershed



- In alignment with SPR's goal to acquire and preserve natural habitat
- The existing City-owned parcels totaling 29,880 sf/.69 acres were donated in 2010
- The subject parcel is adjacent to and for sale by a willing seller
- Acquisition of the subject will bring the City-owned Taylor Creek headwaters to approximately eight acres (north and south of the City line)

Property Description

- Location: 6201 S Fountain St. in southeast Seattle
- **Size**: 14,155 square feet/0.32 acre
- Current Use: Vacant
- Condition: Phase 1 environmental assessment: no Recognized Environmental Conditions (RECs)
- Purchase Price: \$110,000
