Operating Budget

- City priorities:
 - \$2.5m for Seattle's LEAD for public use and drug possession
 - \$800,000 for Seattle to help start up an AI center downtown
- \$4.4 million to eliminate the local government 25% match for Basic Law Enforcement Academy (BLEA) training.
- \$150 million for public and private utilities to provide one-time bill rebates for low- and moderate-income residential electricity customers.
- \$62 million to address housing and services for those who are unhoused.
- \$12 million of CCA revenues to support local governments, organizations, and tribes in searching for, accessing, and reporting on federal grant awards and tax incentives.
- \$25m for DSHS Office of Refugee and Immigrant Assistance (ORIA) for refugee/asylee services



Operating Budget (continued)

- Adds significant investments in behavioral health including:
 - \$16.9 million for assertive community treatment (PACT) teams
 - \$2.6 million for a substance use or drug overdose prevention campaign (HB 1956 or SB 5906)
 - \$3 million for 3 additional health engagement hubs
 - \$3.7 million for street medicine teams (\$1m of that for King County)
 - \$2.5 million for recovery navigator programs
 - \$900,000 public health dispensing machine
 - \$5.2 million to expand distribution of naloxone and \$1.2 million to purchase supply of naloxone for first responders.
 - \$1.85m for DESC opioid recovery and care access
 - \$1m for Evergreen Treatment Services
 - \$1.5m for community based harm reduction programs



Capital Budget

- \$95.6 million in federal funding for Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment Program projects.
- \$127 million increase for the Housing Trust Fund.
- \$45 million for clean building performance grants.
- \$4 million of clean energy retrofit dollars dedicated to grants for energy audits to city-owned tier 1 & 2 buildings.
- \$50 million for clean energy community decarbonization projects.
- \$105 million for Community EV Charging Grants.
- \$25 million for green jobs and infrastructure projects for which cities are eligible to apply.
- \$20m for rapid capital acquisition for properties associated with encampment resolutions on state ROWs
- \$3.5m for DESC opioid recovery care and access
- \$20m for FIFA World Cup
- City priorities:
 - \$1.25m for SPU to help acquire property in South Park

Transportation Budget

- \$196 million for ferry system, including hybrid-electric ferries
- \$30.8 million is invested in traffic safety measures, including \$9.8 million to help curtail speeding, \$7.2 million for the Washington State Patrol, and \$2.5 million to combat impaired driving.
- Fully funds SR 520 cost increase (\$52 million in current biennium and \$770 million in future years)
- \$2 million to WSDOT for right-of-way encampment clean ups
- \$1 million for 2026 World Cup transportation planning
- City priorities:
 - \$4 million for Aurora Avenue North Safety Improvements
 - Additional \$300,000 for Reconnect South Park Project
 - \$500,000 for SDOT Digital Conflict Area Awareness Program



Budget & Revenue

- HB 2044 (Duerr) - Eliminates a nonsupplant restriction applicable to local government taxing districts located in a county with a population of 1.5 million or more (City supports)
- HB 2348 (Street) - Authorizes counties that establish hospitals to use county money, levy taxes, and issue bonds to pay, finance, or refinance capital expenses related to the hospital (City supports)
- HB 2354 (Street) - Requires the project analysis conducted by a local government prior to establishing a tax increment area to assess impacts on all junior taxing districts as well as local emergency medical services and public hospital services. Requires mitigation agreements between local governments and affected public hospital districts



Climate & Environment

- HB 1185 (Hackney) - EPR for mercury light products (City supports)
- HB 1368 (Senn) - Zero emission school buses (City supports)
- HB 1589 (Doglio) - Accelerating PSE's clean energy transition
- HB 1976 (Fosse) - Improving incentive structure for tier 1 and tier 2 buildings for state's energy performance standard (City supports)
- HB 2156 (Reeves) - Solar consumer protections (City supports)
- HB 2301 (Doglio) - Improving organic material waste management (City supports)
- SB 5931 (Salomon) - Addressing 6PPD (City supports)
- SB 6058 (Nguyen) - CCA linkage (City supports)



General Government

- SB 5838 (Nguyen) - Creates an Artificial Intelligence Task Force to assess uses, develop guiding principles, and make recommendations for the regulation of generative artificial intelligence (City supports)
- SB 6040 (Valdez) - Requires the Capital Projects Advisory Review Board to review the extent to which prompt pay statutes meet the needs of small businesses, particularly women and minority-owned businesses (City supports)
- HB 2000 (Mena) - Requires the Office of International Relations and Protocol (OIRP) to create a strategic plan, updated at regular intervals, to guide the state's international engagement and economic development. Modifies the duties of the OIRP, especially with respect to establishing government-to-government relationships, coordinating protocol for receiving foreign dignitaries, and creating an intergovernmental exchange with British Columbia (City supports)



Healthcare & Behavioral Health

- HB 1929 (Cortes) - Establishes the Post-Inpatient Housing Program for Young Adults to provide supportive transitional housing with behavioral health supports for persons ages 18 to 24, who are exiting inpatient behavioral health treatment (City supports)
- HB 1939 (Orwall) - Enacts the Social Work Licensure Compact (City supports)
- HB 1956 (Leavitt) - Directs the Department of Health to develop, implement, and maintain a statewide drug overdose prevention and awareness campaign that meets specified requirements. Requires the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction to make available substance use prevention and awareness materials for school and classroom uses (City supports)
- SB 5906 (Wilson, L) - Requires the Department of Health to develop and maintain an ongoing drug overdose prevention campaign. Requires the Department of Health to conduct a feasibility study for an opioid overdose prevention hotline (City supports)
- HB 2112 (Nance) - Requires public and private institutions of higher education to provide opioid and fentanyl prevention education and awareness to all students. Requires public and private institutions of higher education to make naloxone and fentanyl strips available to students on campus. Requires public and private institutions of higher education to provide education and training on administering naloxone to staff working in residence hall (City supports)



Healthcare & Behavioral Health (continued)

- SB 6095 (Robinson) - Authorizes the Secretary of the Department of Health to issue a prescription or standing order to control and prevent the spread of, mitigate, or treat any disease or threat to public health (City supports)
- HB 2247 (Bateman) - Alters licensure, certification, or registration requirements, practice settings, and reimbursement requirements for psychologists, mental health counselors, social workers, marriage and family therapists, agency affiliated counselors, and substance use disorder professionals (City supports)
- SB 6228 (Dhingra) - Requires health plans to authorize at least 14 days of inpatient or residential substance use disorder treatment on the first utilization review, and at least seven days on subsequent reviews (passed 84-8, City supports)
- HB 2396 (Mosbrucker) - Imposes minimum standards on public outreach campaigns on the dangers of fentanyl and other synthetic opioids. Requires the Department of Health to compile resources on decontaminating motor vehicles. Requires jails to provide individuals with information on substance use disorder treatment programs upon release (City supports)
- SB 6251 (Dhingra) - Allows behavioral health administrative service organizations (BHASOs) to convene regional partners and stakeholders to develop protocols for coordination of the behavioral health crisis response system within available resources. Allows BH-ASOs to recommend 988 contact hub contractors within each regional service area and allows the Department of Health (DOH) to designate the hubs. Requires 988 contact hubs to enter data-sharing agreements with regional crisis lines that include real-time information sharing.

Housing & Homelessness

- HB 1054 (Walen) - Prohibits an association of unit owners in a common interest community from regulating or limiting the number of unrelated persons that may occupy a unit.
- HB 1892 (Leavitt) - Creates the Workforce Housing Accelerator Revolving Loan Fund Program within the Department of Commerce to administer loans to eligible organizations to assist with the development of housing for low income households (City supports)
- HB 1998 (Gregerson) - Requires a city or county planning under the Growth Management Act to allow co-living housing on any lot located within an urban growth area that allows at least six multifamily residential units. Prohibits a city or county from imposing certain regulations or restrictions on co-living housing.
- SB 6015 (Shewmake) - Requires cities and counties to enforce certain parking configurations for residential development
- HB 2329 (Macri) - Requires the Office of the Insurance Commissioner to conduct a study of property and liability coverages available to housing providers receiving housing fund trust resources and serving extremely low-income households (City supports)



Housing & Homelessness (continued)

- HB 2071 (Duerr) - Directs the Washington State Building Code Council to convene two technical advisory groups: one to recommend changes needed to apply the Washington State Residential Code to multiplex housing and another to recommend changes needed to the International Building Code to allow smaller dwelling units.
- SB 6175 (Trudeau) - Allows a city to establish a retail sales and use tax deferral program for the conversion of underutilized commercial property to affordable housing (City supports)
- HB 2012 (Street) - Expands the property tax exemption for nonprofit organizations providing rental housing or mobile home park spaces to qualifying households by allowing nonprofit organizations to receive funding from additional sources (City supports)
- HB 2003 (Connors) - Creates a leasehold excise tax exemption when public lands are used for affordable housing



Labor & Commerce

- HB 2382 (Berry) - Provides that death benefits under the workers' compensation system must be paid to a transportation network company driver if the driver's death results from an injury while the driver was logged onto the TNC's digital network as available for work and physically inside or within the immediate proximity of the TNC driver's vehicle (City supports)
- HB 1905 (Mena) - Extends the prohibitions on discrimination in wages and career advancement opportunities and the remedies to a person's membership in a protected class (passed 36-13, City supports)
- HB 2266 (Stonier) - Requires the Department of Labor and Industries to adopt rules to address safety and health issues for workers performing construction activities who menstruate or express milk, or both (passed 49-0, City supports)
- SB 6007 (Conway) - Concerning employment standards for grocery workers (passed 60-33, City supports)



Labor & Commerce (continued)

- SB 5793 (Saldaña) - Allows an employee to use paid sick leave or sick time when their child's school or place of care has been closed after the federal, state, or local government has declared a public emergency or when necessary to care for an individual who depends on the employee or driver for care or who regularly resides in the employee's or driver's home, so long as the relationship creates an expectation of care (passed 76-19)
- SB 5778 (Keiser) - Prohibits an employer from taking adverse action against an employee for refusal to attend or participate in an employer-sponsored meeting or refusal to listen to speech, the primary purpose of which is to communicate the employer's opinion concerning religious or political matters.
- HB 2022 (Reed) - Requires a prime contractor to obtain a permit before performing any work involving the operation, assembly, disassembly, or reconfiguration of a tower crane. Establishes procedures and requirements for a valid permit, including requirements for safety conferences, inspections, and notifications. Creates criminal penalties for certain violations. Requires local governments to align permit issuance for street closures and provide certain notices.
- SB 6105 (Saldaña) - Requires adult entertainment establishments to provide certain training to its employees. Provides additional requirements regarding panic buttons, customer behavior, security personnel, and notice of termination and limits certain charges to entertainers. Requires the Liquor and Cannabis Board (LCB) to repeal the rule currently codified as WAC 314-11-050, which prohibits liquor licensees from allowing certain actions on their premises and provides for cancellation of license privileges, and to modify or adopt rules to allow adult entertainment establishments to hold liquor licenses. Prevents LCB from issuing a liquor license and requires suspension of a license if an establishment receives a citation for a violation of laws related to adult entertainers and establishments and has not abated the violation.



Public Safety & Criminal Justice

- HB 2088 (Orwall) - Extends liability protections to crisis teams (City supports)
- HB 2153 (Ryu) - Deterring the theft of catalytic converters
- HB 2217 (Cortes) - Provides cases of criminal offense for those under 18 are within the jurisdiction of juvenile court
- SB 5424 (Lovick) - Allows flexible work for law enforcement (City supports)
- SB 6157 (Lovick) - Permits DACA recipients to apply for civil service positions (e.g. law enforcement) (City supports)
- SB 6009 (Trudeau) - Eliminates the use of hog-tying by law enforcement (City supports)
- Gun violence prevention legislation (City supports) – SB 5444 (Valdez)/sensitive places restrictions, HB 1903 (Berry)/lost or stolen firearms, HB 2118 (Walen)/firearm dealers, & HB 2021 (Senn)/firearm disposition



Social Programs & Education

- Childcare affordability, access, & workforce (City supports):
 - HB 2111 (Nance) - Clarifying requirements for subsidized childcare
 - HB 2124 (Eslick) - Expanding program eligibility for subsidized childcare
 - HB 2195 (Callan) - Strengthen the state's early learning facilities funding
 - SB 5774 (Billig) - Improving DCYF's fingerprint background check system
 - SB 6038 (Wilson) - Expands B&O tax exemption for services for children up to 12 years old (previously was up to 7 years old)
- HB 1889 (Walen) - Allowing persons to receive professional licenses and certifications regardless of immigration or citizenship status (City supports)
- HB 1945 (Alvarado) - Streamlining and enhancing program access for persons eligible for food assistance (City supports)
- HB 2415 (Cortes) - Increases the maximum amount of Diversion Cash Assistance that eligible individuals can receive from \$1,500 to \$2,000. (City supports)
- HB 2007 (Peterson) - Expands the TANF time limit extension (City supports)



Transportation

- HB 1989 (Barkis) - Creates the Graffiti Abatement and Reduction Pilot Program within the Department of Transportation (City supports)
- HB 2384 (Donaghy) - Concerning automated traffic safety cameras (City supports)
 - Authorizes certain civilian employees to review infractions detected through the use of local traffic and automated bus safety cameras and to issue notices of infraction.
 - Makes permanent the pilot program permitting traffic cameras to be used for certain stopping and restricted lane violations.
 - Authorizes automated traffic safety cameras to be used to detect speed violations on state routes within city limits that are classified as city streets and in work zones on city streets and county roads.
 - Beginning four years after any new traffic safety camera is initially placed and in use, 25 percent of net revenue in excess of camera administration and infraction processing costs must be deposited into the Cooper Jones Active Transportation Safety Account, with exceptions.
 - Restricts the use of revenue generated by traffic cameras to cities and counties for certain traffic safety activities except and that the revenue must be proportionately spent in overburdened populations.
 - Establishes a maximum \$145 fine amount for all traffic safety camera violations, as adjusted for inflation every five years, and authorizes the doubling of the fine amount for school speed zone infractions. Requires that traffic camera infraction penalties for a first violation and subsequent violation within 21 days of the first violation be reduced to 50 percent of the penalty for recipients of certain state public assistance programs.
 - Allows local governments to adopt use of an online calculator to process and grant requests for reduced fines or penalties.
 - Traffic safety cameras as part of a public transportation vehicle-mounted system may also be used by a transit authority within a county with a population of more than 1.5 million residents.
