Budget & Revenue

- SB 5770 (Pedersen) Increases the property tax revenue limit for local property taxes (City supports)
- HB 2348 (Street) Authorizes counties that establish hospitals to use county money, levy taxes, and issue bonds to pay, finance, or refinance capital expenses related to the hospital (passed 56-41, City supports)

Climate & Environment

- HB 1433 (Duerr) Authorizes cities and counties to require that the owner of a single-family residence obtain and make available a home energy performance report before the residence may be publicly advertised for sale. (passed 55-42, City supports)
- HB 1391 (Ramel) Directs the Department of Commerce to contract with one or more administrators to establish a Statewide Building Energy Upgrade Navigator Program (passed 58-39, City supports)
- HB 1185 (Hackney) Phases out the sale of most mercury-containing lights & extends the existing product stewardship program for mercurycontaining lights beyond its scheduled 2025 sunset until 2039 (passed 52-45, City supports)

General Government

- HB 1932 (Gregerson) Permits cities, towns, and certain special purpose districts to choose to hold their elections in even-numbered years instead of odd-numbered years (passed 52-45)
- HB 1510 (Santos) Requires 30 percent of the sales tax revenue at qualified facilities to be deposited into the Community Preservation and Development Authority (CPDA) Account (passed 94-1, City supports)

Healthcare & Behavioral Health

- HB 1929 (Cortes) Establishes the Post-Inpatient Housing Program for Young Adults to provide supportive transitional housing with behavioral health supports for persons ages 18 to 24, who are exiting inpatient behavioral health treatment (passed 97-0, City supports)
- HB 1939 (Orwall) Enacts the Social Work Licensure Compact (passed 96-0, City supports)
- SB 5241 (Randall) Related to hospital system mergers and acquisitions when there is a detrimental impact on accessible and affordable health care (passed 28-21, City supports)
- SB 6095 (Robinson) Provides authority for the Secretary of Health or the secretary's designee to issue a prescription or standing order for a drug or device for the purpose of controlling a threat to public health (passed 30-19, City supports)

Housing & Homelessness

- HB 1892 (Leavitt) Creates the Workforce Housing Accelerator Revolving Loan Fund Program within the Department of Commerce to administer loans to eligible organizations to assist with the development of housing for low income household (passed 97-0)
- HB 2270 (Morgan) Directs the Office of Financial Management to contract with an external consultant to study the transition of state housing programs to a new state agency and identify gaps in current housing programs (passed 58-39)
- SB 6175 (Trudeau) Allows a city to establish a retail sales and use tax deferral program for the conversion of underutilized commercial property to affordable housing. Creates a definition of "conversion" under the Multifamily Tax Exemption program (passed 48-1, City supports)

Labor & Commerce

- HB 2022 (Reed) Requires a prime contractor to obtain a permit before performing any work involving the operation, assembly, disassembly, or reconfiguration of a tower crane (passed 77-20)
- SB 6007 (Conway) Concerning grocery worker employment standards and retention after mergers or acquisitions (passed 32-16, City supports)
- SB 5291 (Schoesler) Requires the Liquor and Cannabis Board to issue a decision on an application for certain liquor licenses, renewals, or endorsements within 45 days or the application is approved by default (passed 47-2)

Public Safety & Criminal Justice

- HB 1579 (Stonier) Independent prosecutions within AGO for criminal conduct arising from police use of force (passed 53-44, City supports)
- SB 5444 (Valdez) Restricts firearms in libraries, transit centers, aquariums, and zooms (passed 29-20, City supports)
- HB 2021 (Senn) Authorizes local governments and law enforcement agencies to dispose of forfeited firearms through a transfer to a museum or historical society. (passed 68-29, City supports)
- HB 1903 (Berry) Requires a person who suffers a loss or theft of a firearm to report the loss or theft to local law enforcement within 24 hours. (passed 57-40, City supports)

Social Programs & Education

- SB 5774 (Billig) Requires DCYF to maintain the capacity to fingerprint for purposes of fingerprint-based background checks. (passed unanimously, City supports)
- HB 1652 (Taylor) Allow 100% of child support payments to pass through to children. Under current law if a child receives TANF and child support is paid by a non-custodial parent, the state collects and withholds almost all of their child support payments. (passed 95-3, City supports)

Transportation

- SB 5722 (Kuderer) Allows photographs, microphotographs, electronic images, or any records collected with an automated traffic safety camera or photo toll system to be made available to law enforcement pursuant to a lawfully issued search warrant (passed 34-16)
- HB 1963 (Ramos) Requires that license plates must be uncovered (passed 59-38)
